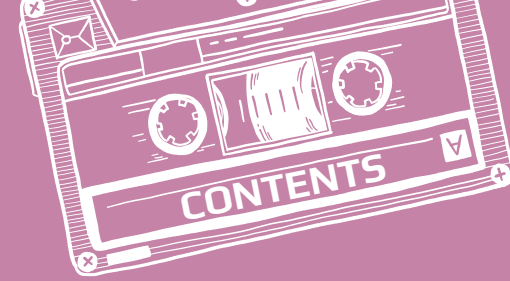

This is your station, your sound, your legacy. Tune in. Lean back. And feel right at home.

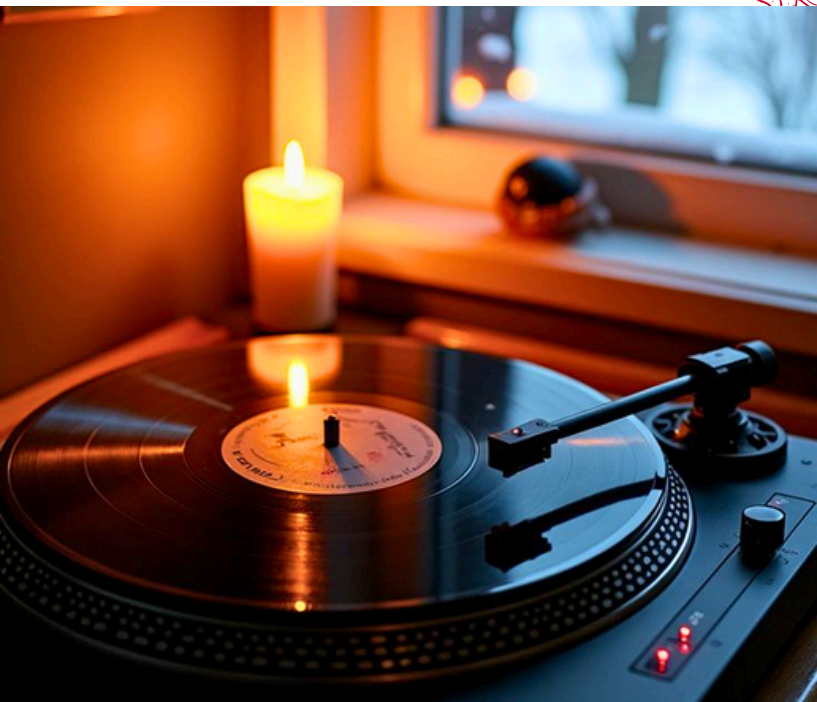

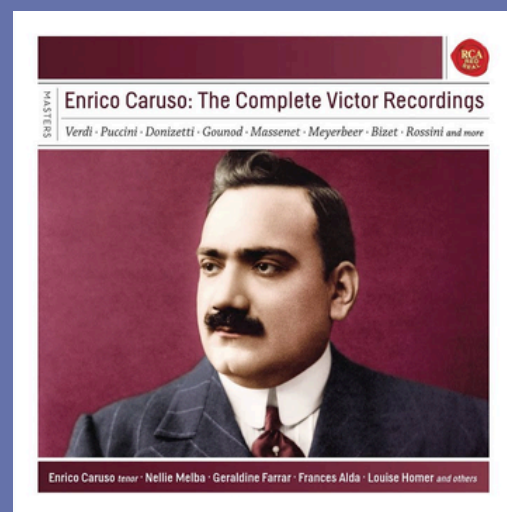

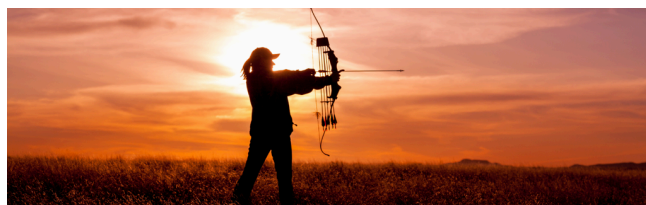
